# Placement goal and objectives (preliminary)

# **Overall Goal:**

To support dairy groups in increasing daily production and reduce losses due to disease and low quality milk. The Animal Health (Dairy) Advisor will support through technical assistance and knowledge-sharing, in line with our One Health approach.

# **Objectives:**

- 1. Provide technical capacity through training to extension officers and animal health technicians at the partner organization.
- 2. Support in training of Community One Health Champions these are a group of lead farmers who offer basic animal welfare training to fellow farmers after making changes on their own farms.
- 3. Support in training community dairy groups on dairy farming.
- 4. Promote gender equality, environmental sustainability and good governance within their placement responsibilities.

# **Volunteer Terms and Conditions**

VWB/VSF covers most of the costs of being a volunteer, including:

- A monthly living allowance (MLA) that will be paid into the volunteer's bank account. If volunteers are recruited from outside this region, they may relocate and be eligible for an MLA
- The MLA is designed to be sufficient to cover simple internet, basic meal requirements, travel and other typical monthly living expenses incurred.
- Volunteers would need to provide proof of address to indicate where they reside in form of Utility bills, lease agreements or any other government/ municipal documents that clearly indicate proof of address.

VWB/VSF encourages each volunteer to raise funds towards the organization's operations.
