Overall Goal:

The primary purpose of the Communication Advisor volunteer is to both document and produce success stories demonstrating the impact of the VETS program as well as build the capacities of the partner organization in capturing stories and videos.

Volunteer Terms and Conditions

VWB/VSF covers most of the costs of being a volunteer, including:

- A monthly living allowance (MLA) that will be paid into the volunteer's bank account. If volunteers are recruited from outside this region, they may relocate and be eligible for an MLA
- The MLA is designed to be sufficient to cover simple internet, basic meal requirements, travel and other typical monthly living expenses incurred.
- Volunteers would need to provide proof of address to indicate where they reside in form of Utility bills, lease agreements or any other government/ municipal documents that clearly indicate proof of address.
