- Applicant must be accepted and enrolled full-time in veterinary school in Canada.
- Applicant is a resident of the NWT, Yukon or Nunavut and have resided in the territory for at least the last two years
- Applicant has demonstrated interest in one health and/or growing access to care in remote communities. Community involvement desirable.
- Applicant intends to work in the territories upon completion of their studies.
- The successful recipient agrees to support VWB through: a speaking engagement and/or presentation at summit, one annual activity in the north during studies, and speaking with communications officer at VWB to highlight their commitment within the year of the scholarship.
- Applications must include all the requested documentation and be submitted as PDF files.
